About the Handling of Personal Information at Kanagawa University

In order to carry out work necessary for education, research, and student support, Kanagawa University makes use of personal information for the purposes outlined below, with sufficient safety control measures in place. Personal information that is made known to the Admission Center through applications is handled as follows.

Purpose of use of personal information

Personal information that is made known to the university is used for the following purposes.

- (1) To send examination admission slips
- (2) To conduct entrance examinations
- (3) To send admission procedure documents, etc.
- (4) For pre-admission education
- (5) For the use of libraries (user registration, book lending, etc.)
- (6) For withdrawal from enrollment and other procedures

About the provision of personal information to third parties

1. Kanagawa University does not provide personal information to third parties except in cases as follows.

- (1) When the person in question has given consent
- (2) When required by laws and regulations
- (3) When deemed necessary to protect the life, person, or property of the person in question

2. About work outsourcing, etc.

The university may outsource the work of handling personal information (data processing, mailing of items, etc.), to the extent necessary for achieving the purposes of use. In the outsourcing of work, the university concludes agreements that clearly specify confidentiality, and performs management and supervision to ensure that the handling of information by the service provider is performed approximately.

Security Export Control

The Kanagawa University Graduate School has established the "Kanagawa University Security Export Control Regulations" based on the "Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act," and strictly manages the acceptance of "foreign students" from the perspective of export of goods, provision of technology and exchange of human resources. If it falls under a regulated item, there may be restrictions on your desired research activities, or there may be cases where you cannot receive education or guidance, **so please take appropriate care, such as prior consultation with your Requested Academic Supervisor who you wish to have supervise you, prior to the submission of your application form.**

Foreign exchange students are required to comply with the Foreign Exchange and Foreign Trade Act when enrolling in the Graduate School.

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1 Kanagawa University Graduate School of Engineering Admissions Policy

■ Master's Program Admissions Policy

1. The capabilities fostered by a graduate school education
 - (1) Advanced knowledge of a field of expertise, and wide-ranging knowledge in other related fields
 - (2) Capabilities for resolving important issues in research from societal and academic perspectives
2. Entrants sought by the Graduate School
 - (1) Persons who possess basic scholarship in the fields of specific Courses
 - (2) Persons who possess the enthusiasm and desire to study a field of expertise in more depth and engage in technology development that will benefit to human society
3. Evaluation of capabilities through university (selection method)

The following four types of entrance examination will be conducted by the Graduate School.

 - (1) General Entrance Examinations will be conducted twice yearly, with scholarship at the university graduation level evaluated on the basis of fundamental and expert subjects, language (English), and an oral examination concerning the chosen major subject.
 - (2) International Student Graduate School Entrance Examinations will be conducted twice yearly for foreigners who request admission for the purpose of acquiring a Master's degree, with scholarship at the university graduation level evaluated on the basis of fundamental and expert subjects, language (Japanese), and an oral examination concerning the capability to understand the lectures and exercise subjects conducted by the Graduate School.
 - (3) Special Selection Entrance Examinations will be conducted twice yearly for prospective university graduates and persons applying within three years of graduation, with evaluation made on the basis of oral examinations and academic performance in university.
 - (4) Special Entrance Examinations for Mature-Aged Applicants will be conducted twice yearly, with evaluation made on the basis of an oral examination concerning expert subjects related to the applicant's personal history, and language (English).

■ Doctoral Program Admissions Policy

1. The capabilities fostered by a graduate school education
 - (1) Leading-edge, advanced knowledge concerning a specialty
 - (2) Capabilities to lead a research group to perform expert research and development
 - (3) International communication capabilities
2. Entrants sought by the Graduate School
 - (1) Persons who possess advanced scholarship in the fields of specific Courses
 - (2) Persons who possess a desire to engage in activity internationally
3. Evaluation of capabilities through Master's program (selection method)

The following three types of entrance examination will be conducted by the Graduate School.

 - (1) General Entrance Examinations: Evaluation will be made on the basis of language (English), and an oral examination concerning the Master's thesis, and major subjects.
 - (2) Special Entrance Examinations for Mature-Aged Applicants: Evaluation will be made on the basis of an oral examination concerning related expert subjects centered on submitted documents, and language (English).
 - (3) International Student Graduate School Entrance Examinations: Evaluation will be made on the basis of language (Japanese or English), and an oral examination concerning the Master's thesis, and major subjects, for foreign nationals who request admission for the purpose of acquiring a Doctoral degree.

8 Selection Method

Selection will be conducted through written examinations and oral examinations. (Written examinations may be waived in cases of Special Selection.) Special Entrance Examinations for Mature-Aged Applicants in the Graduate School of Engineering Master's and Doctoral programs will be conducted through oral examinations only.

9 Special Selection (Master's Program)

Special Selection is a system by which written examinations are waived for persons expecting to graduate university (including those who have graduated university depending on the Graduate School) with particularly outstanding academic performance. The Graduate School of Engineering will waive written examinations for persons who fulfill conditions 1 and 2 below, and whose major or field provides a recommendation. The results of Special Selection will be communicated individually to persons for whom written examinations are waived.

1. Persons expected to graduate university in academic 2020 or who have graduated within 3 years prior to the time of application.
 2. Persons whose average score in all subjects (excluding qualification education courses) is 75 points or higher, or persons who earned grades of AA, A, Excellent, or Very Good in a majority of all subjects, are eligible for Special Selection.
- ◆ Persons exempted from written examinations will be announced on the Kanagawa University Webstation at 15:00 on Wednesday, July 21 for the Autumn Entrance Examinations and Wednesday, February 16 for the Spring Entrance Examinations. Current students or graduates of other universities who are exempted from written examinations will be notified in person by postal mail.
 - ◆ Persons who do not request Special Selection are to submit a written statement to that effect (format not specified) when applying.

10 Reminders Related to Sitting for the Examination

- Arrive at the examination venue at least 20 minutes prior to the start of the examination.
- As a rule, sitting for the examination will not be allowed if 30 minutes have passed since the start of the examination.

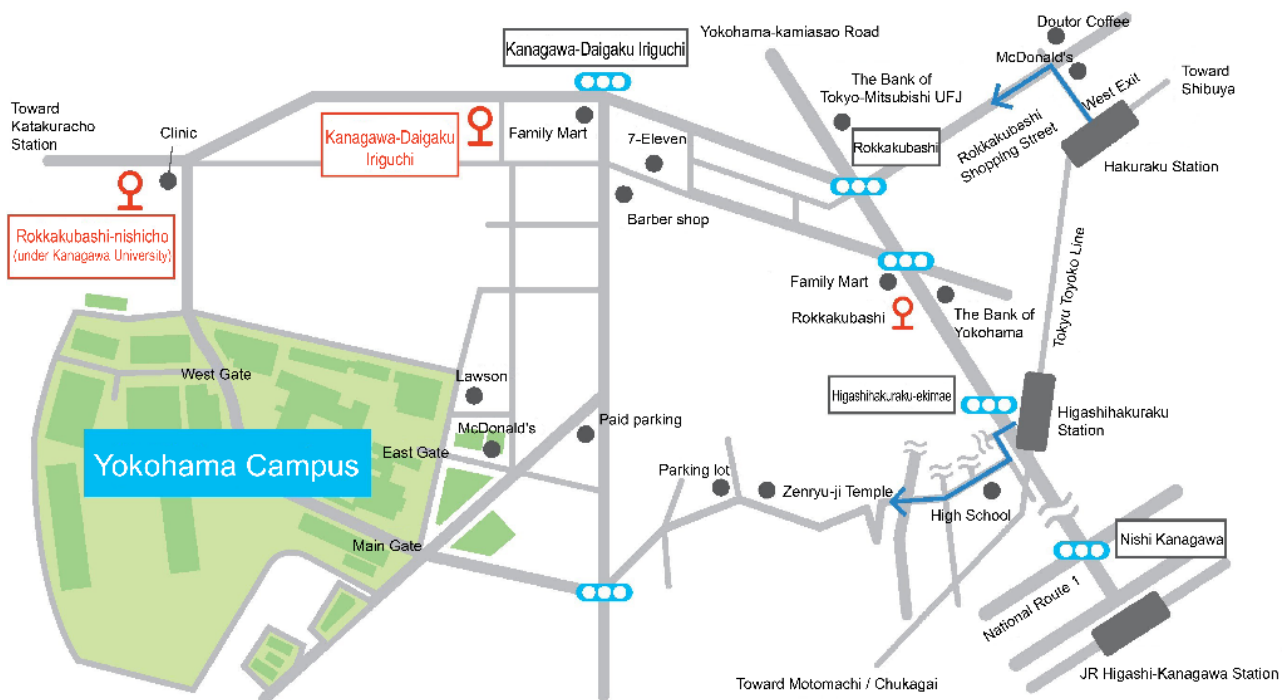

14 About the Graduate School Long-Term Studies System (Master's Program)

This program allows students in the Master's program to request a course of structured study that extends the usual two-year program up to four years, for the purpose of providing more diverse forms of study. In this case, the two-year academic fees will be paid in installments through the recognized year of completion.

(1) Term of long-term studies and duration of enrollment

- The term of long-term studies will be 3 years or 4 years. (Select one at the time of application.)

However, the term is limited to 3 years in the Graduate School of Law and Graduate School of Economics.

- The maximum duration of enrollment in the Master's program is 4 years. In the case that the long-term course student cannot complete the program within four years, the student will be dismissed. Keep this point in mind when applying for the program.

(2) Application procedures

- Enter the required items on the Graduate School Long-Term Studies System Application Form (Form 7 of the university) and submit this together with application documents.

(3) About academic fees

- The amount of two-year academic fees will be paid over the term of the long-term studies (three years or four years). See p18 for details.

(4) About shortening of the duration

- The duration of the program may be shortened **one time only while enrolled**, at the request of the student.
- (*Following the shortening of the duration, application of the long-term studies system may not be requested again.)

 - Problems for Graduate School entrance examinations for academic year 2020 and 2021 (Autumn and Spring) are made public and may be obtained at the Kanagawa University Admission Center. The problems can also be obtained via postal mail, through "Request Materials" – "Graduate School Materials Request Form" on the Kanagawa University website.
 - The Academic Catalog and syllabus for each Graduate School are also available from "Faculties and Graduate Schools" on the website.
2. For people with disabilities and illnesses
 - Consideration should be taken on the day of the entrance examination due to disability (developmental characteristics, use of magnifying glass, hearing aid, wheelchair, etc.) and illness.

If you would like to take the examination, please contact the University Entrance Examination Center one month before the application start date.

Please note that the application after the period may not be considered during the entrance examination. If you do not need consideration on the day of the exam and you need consideration after admission, please inform us immediately after passing the exam so that you can move smoothly to university life.

 - If you need to take care after application due to an unexpected accident, please notify us immediately.
3. Correspondence such as entrance examinations for victims of large-scale disasters
 - Kanagawa University offers the following measures to applicants who wish to take the examination who live in an area affected by a large-scale disaster (a municipality to which the Disaster Relief Act applies).
 - Consideration of entrance examination fee
 - Full exemption from enrollment fee
 - Tuition fee exemption after enrollment (depending on disaster situation)
