0. ERASMUS+ BIPs, a NEW TOOL FOR INTERNATIONAL COLLABORATIVE LEARNING AND COOPERATION

Erasmus+ BIPs are a combination of a virtual/online learning activity and a physical learning activity, enjoyed by a group of students or staff, developed by at least 3 different Erasmus+ HEIs in 3 different Erasmus+ member countries.

1. BLENDED INTENSIVE **PROGRAMMES** (BIPs) AT 2021-2027 **ERASMUS+ PROGRAMME**

1.1. 2021-2027 Erasmus+ Programme

- Erasmus+ is the European Union Programme in the fields of education, training, youth and sport for the period 2021-2027.
- €26.2 billion to support mobility and cooperation.
- Priorities:
 - 1. Inclusion and Diversity
 - 2. Digital Transformation
 - 3. Environment and fight against climate change
 - 4. Participation in democratic life
- Structure:
 - 1. Action 1- Mobility for Individuals
 - 2. Action 2 Cooperation among individuals and organizations

3. Action 3- Support to policy development and cooperation

1.2. Blended Mobilities

UPV / EHU I

- A combination of a physical mobility and a virtual activity before, during or after the physical mobility.
- The objective is to facilitate online and physical learning exchange and teamwork.
- For students, study and traineeship mobility are available in blended format. Teaching and administrative staff can also use blended mobility for teaching a training purposes.
- Blended mobility is primarily targeted at those who have reasons not to go on a fully physical long-term mobility.
- Recommended workload: minimum of 3 ECTS (except Doctoral studies)
- The Erasmus+ programmes provides funding for the physical mobility and organizational support for universities.

1.3. Individual Blended Mobilites V. Blended Intensive Programmes

- 2 ways of organizing Erasmus+ blended mobilities under KA131:
 - 1. Sending an individual student or staff member on a bilateral blended mobility.



- 2. Organizing a group blended learning experience for a group of students or staff.
- 2 types of blended mobilities regarding duration of the physical mobility:
 - 1. Long-term physical presence abroad (min. 2 months).
 - 2. Short-term physical presence abroad (students, min. 5 days / max. 30 days) (staff, min. 2 days max. 60 days).

1.4. Blended Intensive Programmes

- At least 3 Higher Education Institutions (HEI)s awarded with an ECHE coming from at least 3 Erasmus+ Programme countries (partner countries can participate without funding).
- Development of transnational and transdisciplinary curricula.
- Transdisciplinary and multinational teaching and training.
- Multinational active participants from at least 3 countries (Min. 15).
- Innovative ways of learning and teaching, including online collaboration, research-based learning and challenge-based approaches in order to tackle societal challenges.
- With added value compared to existing programmes or courses. Helping to develop transversal competences.
- Opportunity to reach out new groups of students, ie, study fields with few opportunities to study abroad or people who lack confidence to go abroad alone, potentially preparing them for physical mobility next time.

2.1. Main goal and members

To establish the foundations of an open integrated European University System to ensure the free movement of students and staff across the Alliance and share the resources of each member university (current funding until 2023).





3. FIRST BIPs OF THE ENLIGHT EUROPEAN UNIVERSITY

3.1. Organization

- The consortium is organized in different Working Groups. BIPs are being discussed within the Working Group related to International Mobility.
- Regarding the physical activity, each university has access to funding via its regular Erasmus+ KA131 project (for mobility of students and staff). Organizational Funds can be asked by the BIP's coordinating universities.
- In each BIP there is a coordinating university and one or several sending and host universities.
- Participants: 45 students from the 9 universities (5 students from each university).

3.2. Ongoing BIPs for 2021-2022

Two BIPs are already organized for Spring term 2022.
 October -November 2021, students selection procedure open.

- In the near future, these courses should become stable courses and be part of the curricula of each University.

3.3. Experience so far

- Many challenges on stage:
 - 1. Intense collaboration among staff.
 - 2. Teaching staff needs training and support.
 - 3. Different academic calendars among universities.
 - 4. Difficulties to motivate students to participate in a new and still unknown kind of programme that implies working online and travelling for a week.
- Promising, rewarding, with a great potential... but still "fresh".
- First results to be seen in spring 2022.
