WHAT IS COIL?

- C ollaborativ
- O nline
- I nternation al
- **L** earning

- COIL Modules connect accredited courses by two or more universities
- Shared syllabus and teaching responsibilities
- Emphasis on experimental and collaborative student learning
- Students stay enrolled in their home institution
- Students are graded by their own instructor
- Requires only 2 lecturers that get along
- no need for cooperation agreement



HISTORY

- Current COIL Module is based on a workshop that started 25 years ago
 - German American International Business Workshop (GAIW)
 - HAW Hamburg California State University Long Beach (CSULB)
- Prior to COVID-19 bi-annual workshops with reciprocal visits
 - Summer Term: Workshop in Hamburg Winter Term: Workshop in Long Beach
- May 2020: Workshop was cancelled due to COVID-19
- October 2020: GAIW goes online as a COIL module
- October 2021: Inclusion of two additional Spanish universities
 - Universidad de Las Palmas de Gran Canaria (ULPGC) & Universidad de C (UC)



STATUS QUO: GAIW 2022

- COIL Module integration
 - International Organization and Cooperation (HAW), Global Business Project (CSULB)
- Business Elective on Graduate Level (ULPGC & UC)
- in total 59 students (also includes international exchange students)
- Provision of learning materials and uploading of assignments on CSULB e-learning platform CANVAS
- Topic: Port competitiveness in times of external shocks leading to supply chain disruptions: Implications for the Port of Hamburg (Germany), Port of Long Beach (USA), Port of Los Angeles (USA), Port of Santander (Spain) and Port of Las Palmas (Spain).



STATUS QUO: GAIW 2022

- Students were separated in 12 teams and received team an individual tasks
- Theoretical input by lecturers given both synchronously (via Zoom) and asynchronously (pre recorded lectures)
- Weekly guest speakers from the industry
 - Port Authorities of Long Beach, Los Angeles, Hamburg, Santander and Las Palmas, Hapag Lloyd, UNCTAD and more
- Team output by the end of the module: Research Report, Research Video, and Presentation of Results
- Module timeframe: October 4th to December 8th



CHALLENGES: GAIW 2022

Communication with a larger number of faculty (including lecturers and TAs)
