





To go to a Goal page and see all the content relevant to that goal, click on a goal within the SDG wheel and you will be directed to the goal page





Filter a search result using filters

Open Access

Free Access

You can use this filter to only show Open Access and Free Access contents. But Kanagawa University has full access, so you do not need to use this filter.

PUBLICATION DATE:

You can narrow the search result by publication date. Please type in specific year in "Choose from year" part i.e. 2018 to 2020

IMPRINT: Filter by T&F's publishing imprints (brands)

RESOURCES: You can filter by Teaching and Learning Resources' type (i.e. Case studies, Essays, Webinar). This filter is only shown when you select "All" or "Teaching and Learning Resources" tab.

GOALS: You can filter by specific goal when you have done a search by keyword. If you have selected the goal first, you can add one more goal to the search.

i.e. Select Goal 1 and then add Goal 2 in the filter. You'll be able to see contents related to both Goal 1 and 2.

検索のヒント - Tips when you search contents

目標別検索とキーワード検索は以下のように使い分けることができます。
You can use different search methods depending on the situation.

例1) グループワークで目標1と目標2について、調べることになった。細かいトピックは決まっておらず、ひとまず目標について調べたい。

Case 1) Your group has picked Goal 1 and Goal 2 for a project. No detail is fixed yet, your group wants to gather relevant information regarding Goal 1 and Goal 2.

この場合は、まず目標1をトップページ、またはページトップの“SDGs”より選択します。その後、GOALSのフィルターを使い、目標2を選択します。目標1と目標2に関連したコンテンツが表示されます。In this case, you can select “Goal 1” on the top page or SDGs on upper right. Then select “Goal 2” in “GOALS” filter.

例2) 各国の目標5に関する情報を集めることになり、インドの担当になった。

Case 2) You are in charge of researching India’s present situation on Goal 5.

この場合は、まず“India”をキーワード検索をしてください。その後、“GOALS”のフィルターを使って、目標5を選択してください。

In this case, you first need to do a search by keyword, “India”. Then select “Goal 5” by in “GOALS ” filter.

先に目標を選択する方法だと、キーワードでの絞り込みができないので、検索したいキーワードがある場合は、先にキーワード検索をして、そこからフィルターを使って目標で絞り込むのがお勧めです。

If you do “Search by goal” first, you can’t add a keyword. If you have a keyword you’d like to search, do a keyword search first and then filter by a goal by using “GOALS” filter.





