**IMPRINT:** Filter by T&F's publishing imprints (brands)

**RESOURCES:** You can filter by Teaching and Learning Resources' type (i.e. Case studies, Essays, Webinar). This filter is only shown when you select "All" or "Teaching and Learning Resources" tab.

**GOALS:** You can filter by specific goal when you have done a search by keyword. If you have selected the goal first, you can add one more goal to the search.

i.e. Select Goal 1 and then add Goal 2 in the filter. You'll be able to see contents related to both Goal 1 and 2.

この場合は、まず"India"をキーワード検索をしてください。その後、"GOALS"のフィルターを使って、 目標5を選択してください。 In this case, you first need to do a search by keyword, "India". Then select "Goal 5" by in "GOALS " filter.

If you do "Search by goal" first, you can't add a keyword. If you have a keyword you'd like to search, do a keyword search first and then filter by a goal by using "GOALS" filter.
